What to bring checklist – Two Canyons or Best of the Canyon

This list includes what you will be wearing the first day of the trip. Consider bringing a change of clothes to leave in our vehicle in case you wish to change at the end of your trek.

Havasu Falls Portion of trip

- 3 (three) liters of water
- Sunglasses
- Wide-brimmed hat
- Lightweight, quick-dry towel
- Compact toiletry/personal items kit
- Personal medical supplies (prescription meds, supplements, other medical related)
- Hiking shoes or boots (be sure to break-in before trip)
- Sports sandals or water shoes (some people bring old athletic shoes for the water)
- 3 synthetic or synthetic-wool blend socks
- 1-2 pair of hiking shorts
- 1 bathing suit (for crossing and/or swimming in water)
- 3 changes of underwear (recommend non-cotton, breathable, quick-dry)
- 1-2 short-sleeved shirts (breathable, wicking recommended)
- Sleepwear
- Small flashlight or headlamp
- Rain poncho and/or other rain gear (jacket with hood, nylon shell, rain pants, etc.)
- Back up pair of glasses or contacts
- Camera and film
- Cash for souvenirs, guide gratuity, personal expenses
- At least 1-2 zip lock bags to keep things dry when in water/rain
- Paperback book
- Journal and pen
- Sunscreen
- Post card postage and a few addresses (Havasu post office one of two mule-carried postal systems in the United States)

If traveling in cooler months ([Click here](#) for weather forecasts)

- Fleece jacket
- Gloves
- Wool hat
- Long-underwear layers
- Long-sleeved shirt
- Clothes to layer

All of your gear (except daypack and water) needs to fit into a soft side 24"x12"x12" duffel which will be put in a larger Discovery Treks duffel and carried on horse to campsite or lodge. Maximum weight for your duffel is 10 lbs.

For Day hike portions of trip

- Hiking shoes or boots (be sure to break in before trip)
 - Rain gear (lightweight nylon top as occasional thunderstorms are year round at the Grand Canyon and weather conditions can change quickly)
 - Wide-brimmed hat
 - Sunglasses
 - Sunscreen
 - Hiking shorts and t-shirt (warm weather hikes) - Consider convertible-type pants
 - Long pants, warm top, gloves, fleece or wool hat (cooler weather hikes)
 - o *(South rim is at 7,000 feet so winter hikes can be cold)*
 - Camera and film
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- √ Discovery Treks daypacks may be reserved on a first-come, first-served basis to carry your personal items.
 - √ Trekking poles may also be reserved for use.
